



The 11 Essentials: Set up AVID

1. Student Selection

Focus on those students in the academic "middle"

2. Voluntary Participation:

Students and Staffulty have to want participate

3. AVID Elective

Must take place during the instructional day

4. Enrollment

For AVID to impact campus wide - students must be exposed to the most rigorous curriculum: acceleration not remediation

The 11 Essentials: Deliver AVID

- 5. **Organizational** Skills Promoting academic self-management
- 6. Writing and Reading to Learn
- 7. Inquiry and Collaboration to learn and promote critical thinking
- 8. Trained Tutors

The 11 Essentials: Support AVID

- 9. Data **Collection** and **Analysis** to inform instruction and schoolwide implementation.
- 10. School and District resource commitments
- 11. Active interdisciplinary Site Team

Instruction

AVID Schoolwide <u>instruction</u> occurs when the entire instructional staff utilizes AVID strategies, other best instructional practices, and 21st century tools to engage and ensure college readiness

Systems

When <u>systems</u> are in place that support governance, curriculum and instruction, data collection and analysis, professional learning and student/parent outreach to ensure college readiness and improved academic performance for all students.

Leadership

Leadership sets the vision and tone that promotes college readiness and high expectations for all students in the school.

Culture

Schoolwide <u>culture</u> is evident when the AVID philosophy progressively shifts beliefs and behaviors resulting in an increase of students meeting college readiness requirements.

AVID Is Schoolwide

when ...

instruction, systems, leadership and culture are strong.

Schoolwide means college readiness is accessible to all, there are improved academic opportunities for all and purpose is clearly aligned.





Enrollment and Persistence

2010 AVID Graduates

Over 22,000 AVID seniors were submitted to the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) in the winter of 2010

Year 1 of College in 2010 - 14,765 (67%) were found to have enrolled at a two-year or four-year institute during the first autumn after graduation

Year 2 of College in 2011 - 86% enrolled in their second year of college

Year 3 of College in 2012 - 78% enrolled in their third year of college

Year 4 of College in 2013 -It appears that 70% - 74% enrolled in their fourth year of college

- 35 Districts
- 169 Sites
- 6,980 students in the AVID elective

Washington - state participation & growth

- 71 Districts
- 287 Sites
- 15,059 students in the AVID elective

AVID at two showcase high schools

Columbia River High School:

8% of all students are enrolled in AVID in the elective

45% of Faculty have been to Summer Institute - 9th grade will move to SBG with 9th Academy model (English, Env. Science & Health) + WICOR

30% increase in IB testing due to district paying for all exams - goal is 100%

98% participation in SAT (11th) & PSAT for grades 10-12

Century High School:

16% of all students are enrolled in the AVID elective

70% of teachers have been to Summer Institute or Path Training

From 261 students to 585 students taking at least one AP class since implementation of AVID.

Every AVID student takes the PSAT, ACT Aspire and/or ACT, SAT.






