Conference Goals

- Identify barriers and policy gaps influencing absenteeism.
- Highlight site and district-based strategies that can inform legislation.
- Develop 2-3 actionable ideas to facilitate increased attendance by Oregon students.
- Build partnerships for equitable student attendance solutions.

Roundtable Discussion (30 Minutes)

Goal: Examine root causes and barriers contributing to student absenteeism.

Guiding Questions:

- What are persistent barriers to regular attendance?
- Which policies or practices help or hinder efforts?
- What's one local strategy that could be scaled?
- What additional supports or coordination would make the biggest difference?

Jigsaw Collaboration (30 Minutes)

Goal: Share findings across groups to surface themes and develop actionable recommendations.

Steps:

- 1. Each member summarizes their roundtable insights.
- 2. Identify overlapping themes, gaps, and bright spots.
- 3. Capture joint recommendations for policy-practice alignment.

Reflection & Closing

Actionable ideas and steps:

- 1. Outreach that targets meeting students' needs (food, clothing, housing)
 - Outreach generally falls on community's shoulders
- 2. Accountability / lack of accountability
- HS students needing just 1-2 credits, engagement and attendance TO classes
- 3. Parent accountability VS need for attention of parents

Reflection & Closing

Actionable ideas and steps:

- 4. Schools trying to fill "gaps" for students and families
 - What re the "supports" that are in place? Protocols?
 - What is aligned across schools, levels, state?
- 5. Reality of safety for students and families
 - Current administration's enforcement approach
- 6. Creating partnerships that care for BOTH students and families
